PUBLIC SESSION

One resident presented concerns with Bylaw No. 911 for rezoning of lots in Forest Grove from (R-1) Single Family Residential to (R-2) General Residential. Mayor Lagace explained this application had been withdrawn since a portion of the property in question had already been zoned R-2. One resident said that he was under the understanding that this would be multi-family housing. CAO, Carolyn Gaunt presented a map to the public present and explained the zoning that exists in the area. She said there will be no apartment buildings. She explained duplexes in an R-2 zoned area is a discretionary use. This means developing duplexes on these lots would need to be reviewed by and approved by

the Subdivision and Development Board. Such a development would also have to be advertized and letters sent to surrounding owners. One resident said he was told their property value would drop if this type of housing was built. Another resident commented multifamily dwellings bring up your property value. The CAO said when this development goes ahead there will be a requirement to provide a secondary road access to the north. Mayor Lagace said it is in the 2013 budget to widen 93rd street and we are working with the developer to put in another road access. Councillor Siggelkow said, I live in Rycroft Ridge and I haven't noticed the R-2 zoning in my neighborhood. A resident asked if there would be a fence going up around the storm pond in Forest Grove. Mayor Lagace said this has been looked into. There is no requirement to fence the pond. It will be pumped down every year. The CAO also noted that with more development in the Forest Grove area a playground will become a requirement.
